

Dear Parents and Students of Astoria School District,

Starting on Monday, February 8th, the Astoria School District meal program will be making some changes in order to better serve our students and their families. The Astoria School District will be making available 5 days' worth of breakfasts and lunches, delivered to your residence (**someone must be available to accept delivery**) or available for pick-up on Fridays from Astoria Middle School or Astoria High School from 9:00 am- 11:00 am.

The 5-day meal package **must** be requested by filling out a meal request form. [ASD Home Delivery/Meal Pick Up Form](#). This form is also available on the School Districts home page . If you do not have internet access, you may call in your order Friday mornings between 8:00am-9:00 am at (503)-325-4177. In order to prepare sufficient meals, the online form must be completed **no later** than 12:00 pm on Friday, prior to the delivery week. For bulk delivery starting on February 8th, the deadline will be Friday, February 5<sup>th</sup>. After February 11<sup>th</sup>, normal meal delivery buses will no longer deliver meals.

Menus, along with meal directions will be posted on the Astoria School Districts website and will be passed out with bulk meal packages.

The delivery areas will be as follows:

Mondays-Route 1A: Walluski, River Point, Southeast Front Street.

Mondays-Route 1B: Williamsport Road, out on 202.

Tuesdays- Route 2A: Young's River Road.

Tuesdays-Route 2B: Lewis & Clark Road, Logan Road, Peter Johnson, Upper Lewis & Clark, Hwy 101 Business.

Wednesdays- Route 3A: East Astoria from Emerald Heights East.

Wednesdays- Route 3B: Wednesdays- East of 16th Street to Blue Ridge and Valmay.

Thursdays- Route 4A: All West Marine, Coast Guard Housing, Alameda, Peter Pan Area.

Thursdays- Route 4B: Bond Street, Franklin, Irving.

**\*\*Normal food delivery routes will be followed until all areas have been transitioned into bulk meals.**
